Today you are going to be planning and then writing the next paragraph of your report. This paragraph will describe the island, what can be found there and what it looks like.


The purpose of this paragraph is to help create a picture in the reader's mind of the place you are describing.

Please make sure that you have the finished example open while planning. This will help you to see how we have used the plan to write the paragraph.


Planning

Non-chronological report checklist:

- I have written in the past tense
- I have used the third person (**not** 'I' or 'me')
- I have described the different places on the island, to help create a vivid picture in the reader's mind.
- I have included ambitious vocabulary
- I have used expanded noun phrases (adjectives)
- I have used fronted adverbials
- I have used conjunctions
- I have remembered capital letters and full stops.
- I have re-read it to make sure it gives information clearly to the reader.
