Maths

L.I. To convert 24-hour times to 12-hour times.

Example question:

When you see the digital time, can you convert it to numbers and words?

Can you match the equivalent 12-hour and 24-hour times?

Activity:

Using the table provided, take the 24-hour times and change them to 12-hour times. Then, write them in words in the last column.

You should then choose the best time that fits with the activity e.g. I get up at...the choices are 07:30 or 19:30. The answer is obviously 07:30 as this time indicates the morning.

Extension:

Rewrite the paragraph on the **My Day Sheet** on the PowerPoint. Where you see a 24-hour time, change it to words and numbers using either 'in the morning', 'in the afternoon' or 'in the evening'. The first time has been written for you.

It is a diary so you can use informal language but try to avoid using slang words or abbreviations, for example: you should be writing 'going to' not 'gonna'.
