



- These are available through the Little Wandle website and a link will be added to Google Classroom for you to use.



Phonics Screening Check

- All Year 1 children will complete the Phonics Screening Check in June this year.
- Any child in Year 2 that didn't meet the required mark will also re do the check in June.

- The purpose of the phonics screening check will be to confirm that all children have learned phonic decoding to an age appropriate standard.
- The phonics check will help teachers identify the children who need extra help, so they can receive the support they need to improve their reading skills.








Next Steps

- As part of Little Wandle, the children will be having regular reading sessions in class.
- Each session will be focusing on Decoding, Prosody and Comprehension.

 - o a reading practice book matched to your child's phonic stage that they can read independently
 - o a sharing book that they can talk about and enjoy with you.
